## 2015 Seasonal Influenza and Pneumonia Immunization Schedule

Influenza and pneumonia vaccines will be available in Richland County through the Richland County Health & Human Services Public Health at the following locations at the specified dates and times:

An annual flu shot is recommended for everyone 6 months of age and older. Those at higher risk of influenza complications are:

- Persons 50 years of age or older.
- Children 6-59 months of age and those who live with them and their out of home caregivers.
- Residents of long-term care facilities housing persons with chronic medical conditions.
- Anyone with a long term health problem such as heart, lung or kidney disease, asthma, metabolic disease such as diabetes, or anemia and other blood disorders
- Anyone with a weakened immune system (HIV/AIDS or on cancer drugs)
- Anyone aged 6 months to 18 years especially if on long term aspirin therapy
- Pregnant women
- Healthcare workers or anyone in close contact with people at risk of serious illness

Talk with your healthcare provider before getting a flu shot if you:

- Ever had a serious allergic reaction to eggs or to a previous dose of influenza vaccine
- Have a history or Guillain-Barre Syndrome

## Standard Influenza vaccine is \$40.00, High-Dose Influenza vaccine is \$50.00. Pneumonia vaccine is \$75.00.

Influenza and pneumonia vaccines are reimbursable by Medicaid and Medicare Part B. People with Medicaid or Medicare Part B will be required to present their Medicaid or Medicare card at the clinic and will not have to pay for the vaccines. If Medicare Part B is not your primary coverage (eg. You are covered by a Medicare HMO) you may be required to pay for the immunizations, as we are not providers for all insurance carriers.
