RESOLUTION NO. 09-17

A Resolution To Authorize Creation Of Mississippi Valley Health Services Commission And Participation Of Richland County.

WHEREAS the Richland County Board of Supervisors previously adopted a resolution authorizing the formation of a nonstock entity known as Mississippi Valley Health Services, Inc.; and

WHEREAS the aforementioned resolution authorized Richland County to be a member of the nonstock corporation, and

WHEREAS the members of the nonstock corporation currently consist of La Crosse County, Crawford County, Monroe County, Juneau County, Vernon County, Chippewa County, Sauk County, Marinette County, Richland County, Rock County and Trempealeau County, and

WHEREAS the nonstock corporation was formed for the purpose of, among other things, transferring legal and operational responsibility for the Medicaid certified nursing home facility known as Lakeview Health Center located in La Crosse County ("Lakeview") to a multi-county collaboration governed by the nonstock corporation, and

WHEREAS the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services raised concerns regarding the organizational structure of the nonstock corporation as it relates to the multi-county collaboration, and

WHEREAS all of the public policy reasons for forming a multi-county collaborative for purposes of leasing and administering Lakeview continue to exist, as is more particularly set forth in the introductory paragraphs of the aforementioned resolution, and

WHEREAS based upon the Department of Health Services' concerns, the Richland County Board of Supervisors deems it to be in the best interests of Richland County to enter into an agreement under Wis. Stat. § 66.0301 related to the formation of a commission that would allow multiple counties to collaboratively own and administer Lakeview, and

WHEREAS the Richland County Board of Supervisors agrees that it is in the best interests of Richland County to enter into the aforementioned agreement based upon the needs of Richland County residents as it relates to the superior care and treatment afforded Richland County residents at Lakeview, which care and treatment would potentially cease if Richland County did not enter into the aforementioned agreement, and

WHEREAS this resolution is intended to authorize the creation of the Mississippi Valley Health Services Commission and appoint a member of the Richland County Board of Supervisors to act as the member representative, as is more particularly set forth in the Intergovernmental Agreement attached hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Richland County Board of Supervisors hereby takes the following action:

1. Richland County hereby enters into the Intergovernmental Agreement attached hereto and authorizes the appropriate Richland County official to execute the Intergovernmental Agreement on behalf of Richland County.

2. Richland County hereby ratifies the actions of the Mississippi Valley Health Services, Inc., Board of Directors and Members in authorizing the dissolution of Mississippi Valley Health Services, Inc.

3. Richland County hereby authorizes the transfer of all money that Richland County paid to Mississippi Valley Health Services, Inc., to Mississippi Valley Health Services Commission.

4. Richland County hereby authorizes the Chair of the Richland County Board of supervisors to appoint a representative to act on behalf of Richland County as a member of the Commission consistent with the Intergovernmental Agreement.

5. Richland County hereby authorizes the appointment of one (1) commissioner to represent the interests of Richland County on the Commission Board with respect to the Commission's business and affairs consistent with the Intergovernmental Agreement, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any provisions of Resolution No. 08-149 (Amended) which conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall be effective as of January 1, 2009.
