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3	AMENDING CHAPTER 15 OF THE DANE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES,
4	CREATING AN INDEPENDENT CITIZEN REDISTRICTING COMMISSION
5 6	The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Dane does ordain as follows:
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8	ARTICLE 1. Unless otherwise expressly stated herein, all references to section
9	and chapter numbers are to those of the Dane County Code of Ordinances.
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11	ARTICLE 2. Section 15.47 is created to read as follows:
12	15.47 REDISTRICTING COMMISSION. (1) Composition. The Redistricting
13	Commission shall consist of eleven (11) citizen members who are residents of
14	Dane County and are appointed as provided herein.
15 16	(a) Appointments shall be made through an application process structured to
16 17	recruit candidates from broad and diverse sections of the Dane County electorate.
18	(b) From those individuals who apply, the County Board Chair shall appoint an
19	individual who is a resident of the City of Madison, a resident of a town in Dane
20	County, and a resident of a city or village other than the City of Madison. Prior to
21	making these appointments, the Chair shall confer with the City of Madison, the
22	Dane County Towns Association, and the Dane County Cities and Villages
23	Association regarding the appointment.
24	(c) The County Board Chair and the County Clerk shall each appoint four (4)
25	additional citizen members from the pool of applicants that meet the eligibility
26	<u>criteria.</u>
27	(d) Members of the commission shall serve from the time of appointment until
28	completion of the redistricting process following the decennial census. A vacancy
29	occurring during the redistricting process shall be filled consistent with this
30 31	section. (2) Eligibility Criteria. All members of the Commission shall be residents of Dane
32	County and meet the following criteria:
33	(a) May not be a member of the Dane County Board, an employee of Dane
34	County or a contract consultant;
35	(b) May not be a lobbyist registered with the Dane County Board;
36	(c) May not hold or have held an official position with a political party or partisan
37	organization within the year prior to appointment;
38	(d) May not have participated in the State of Wisconsin 2011 partisan
39	redistricting process;
40	(e) Must be impartial, which includes refraining from engaging in any political
41	party activity or supporting the election or defeat of any candidate or referendum
42	during their tenure on the commission, and at the time of appointment no intent
43	to seek election to the office of county board supervisor in the spring primary and
44 45	general election immediately following redistricting;
45 46	(f) Have a familiarity with maps; (g) Disclose any potential conflict of interest in conformance with s. 9.60.
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47	(3) The county clerk and the Planning & Development Department shall provide
48	the commission with such staff assistance as may be required to carry out its
49	functions.
50	(4) The commission shall use the following criteria and procedure to develop a
51	proposed redistricting plan for consideration by the county board.
52	(a) Within 30 days after the population count by census block becomes available
53	in printed form from the federal government or is published by a state agency.
54	but no later than May 15th following the year of each decennial census, the
55	commission shall propose a tentative county supervisory district plan and map. In
56	preparing the tentative plan and map and in making any adjustments to the
57	tentative plan, the commission shall be guided by the criteria set forth in Wis.
58	Stat. s. $59.10(3)(b)$ and sub (b).
59	(b) The mapping process shall include opportunities for the public to submit map
60 C1	proposals for consideration.
61 62	(c) The commission shall develop up to three maps for consideration by the county board that divide the county into the number of districts determined by the
63	county board. In the preparation of its plan for dividing the county into districts
64	for the election of county board supervisors, the commission shall apply
65	applicable state and federal law, which shall control in the event of any conflict
66	with this ordinance. The commission shall also apply the criteria set forth in the
67	following paragraphs to the maximum extent practicable. The following
68	paragraphs shall be applied and given priority in the order in which they
69	are listed.
